

## ERASMUS+ STUDENT MOBILITY BETWEEN PROGRAMME AND PARTNER COUNTRIES CALL 2019

### KEY ACTION 1 – LEARNING MOBILITY

#### HIGHER EDUCATION (HE) between Programme and Partner Countries, KA107-2019

Activity type	The amounts for individual support (costs directly linked to the subsistence of participants during the activity in destination country)	Lump sum for travel
Incoming <b>students</b> (mobilities from partner countries to Poland)	<b>800 EUR</b> per month	According to distance calculator
Outgoing <b>students</b> (mobilities from Poland to partner countries)	<b>700 EUR</b> per month	
Incoming <b>staff</b> (mobilities from partner countries to Poland)	<b>140 EUR</b> per day up to the 14 <sup>th</sup> day of stay and <b>98 EUR</b> per day from 15 <sup>th</sup> day of stay	
Outgoing <b>staff</b> (mobilities from Poland to partner countries)	<b>180 EUR</b> per day up to the 14 <sup>th</sup> day of stay and <b>126 EUR</b> per day from 15 <sup>th</sup> day of stay	

For grant support to travel costs in the Erasmus+ programme, travel distances must be calculated using the distance calculator:

Travel distances <sup>1</sup>	Amount
Between 10 and 99 KM:	20 EUR per participant
Between 100 and 499 KM:	180 EUR per participant
Between 500 and 1999 KM:	275 EUR per participant
Between 2000 and 2999 KM:	360 EUR per participant
Between 3000 and 3999 KM:	530 EUR per participant
Between 4000 and 7999 KM:	820 EUR per participant
8000 KM or more:	1500 EUR per participant

### **Organisational support – lump sum**

The university pursuing mobility with partner countries (KA107-2019) has the right to receive a lump sum of EUR 350 for mobility each that is correctly implemented and settled.

<sup>1</sup> Based on the travel distance per participant. Travel distances must be calculated using the distance calculator supported by the European Commission ([http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/tools/distance\\_en.htm](http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/tools/distance_en.htm)). The **distance of a one-way travel** must be used to calculate the amount of the EU grant that **will support the round trip**.

The "travel distance" represents the distance between the place of origin and the venue, whereas the "amount" covers the contribution to the travel both to and from the venue.
