




National Legal Framework for ICM recognition



- ✓ NQF description of qualifications based on mix QF4EHEA and EQF4LLL (2011)
- ✓ Law of Ukraine "On Higher Education" (2014) & Law of Ukraine "On Education" (2017)
- ✓ **Regulation on academic mobility** approved by the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine (2015) (is being updated currently)
- ✓ List of Fields of Study and Program Subject Areas in Higher Education based on the ISCED approved by the MESU (2015) (is being updated currently)
- ✓ **Regulation on PhD studies** with educational component and described competencies (*research*, *teaching*, *foreign language*, *research project management etc.*) approved by the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine (2016)





Higher Education Institution Internal Regulations and procedures

(aiming at creation of internal corporate culture and

- ✓ Strategies on HEIs' strategic development; responsibility for ICM recognition)
- ✓ HEIs' internationalisation strategies;
- ✓ **Internal regulations** on international cooperation and/ or academic mobility with recognition mechanisms and procedures;
- ✓ Official regulations on study process
- ✓ Documents on international cooperation;
- ✓ Decentralisation of ICM project implementation to Faculties and Chairs;
- ✓ Human resources development, promotion, professional growth, language etc.
- ✓ **Quality Assurance systems** in universities (modernised curricula, competence-based approach, learning outcomes, ECTS, student-centered approach, etc.)





ICM recognition by Ukrainian Universities: achievements



(based on Universities' shared experience and ICM monitoring)

- Institutional level: the most active universities in ICM implement effective recognition procedures and tools, and create good and best practices to share among Ukrainian universities:
 - ✓ good match of fields of knowledge and subject areas in ICM partner universities;
 - ✓ thorough preparation of Learning Agreements;
 - ✓ active communication between university departments;
 - ✓ decentralisation of ICM responsibilities to Faculty Coordinators of academic mobility;
 - √ recognition by Dean's Offices at Dean's level, etc.;
 - ✓ motivation of staff for ICM promotion and its effective implementation in HEIs.





ICM recognition by Ukrainian Universities: achievements



(based on Universities' shared experience and ICM monitoring)

- Individual level of universities' staff and students:
 - ✓ personal leadership and dedication of HEIs' Rectors and Vice-rectors to ICM recognition obligations;
 - ✓ ICM participants (staff & students) are **agents** in creation of ICM recognition culture and extending responsibility for recognition, etc.;
 - ✓ implementation of **new experiences** by staff into educational and administrative work process (e.g. to develop a new professional course(es) in foreign languages, to introduce innovative methods for learning and teaching, to provide new students services; to develop and update the strategy on internationalisation, to update procedures and processes in ICM etc.).













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
