Management of EISCAS

- Centrally Coordinated
- Documentation / templates / guidelines
- Budget:
 - PMI
 - Transnational Meetings
 - Training & Teaching
- Bilateral contact with task leaders
- Editorial Triumvirate
- Evaluation
 - Methodology





Some tips on how to Apply

- Adapt form to content not the other way round
- Agree on fees and meetings with partners
- Always tell them less work days than you plan to give them
- Make sure your networks extend into your target groups
- Make stepping stones for your main ouputs and consult with task leaders
- Use evaluation methodology for designing events and outputs

Some tips on how to Apply

- Coordinators Team up (2-3 people max!)
- Writing Boot camp! (clear calendar!)
- Work in parallel (formalities partner roles grant writing)
- Choose partners wisely (Experience vs. Personal)

Use a Pre-mortem technique

Use basic productivity tools:

- Archivizing (one-note/evernote)
- Zero-inbox
- Getting-things-done

Other Tips – for when you get it!

- Don't start with an event in Month 1
- Make sure you have access to credit
- Consortium agreement

- Never cease finding new partners
- For Dissemination Look from the perspective of your target groups



- Achievement and indicators
- Solving disputes

- Budget overview financial framework
- Banking info of all partners
- Reporting & Audits
- Ownership of intellectual outputs
- Logo & Visibiliy of EU funding
- Liability & Jurisdiction
- Termination of contract
